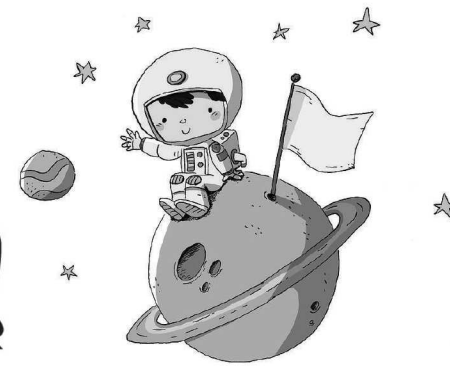
Brooke Raby, 2nd, Hilton Elementary, Mrs. Edwards
